

1.) What inspired you to pursue Civil services after an MBA instead of continuing your corporate career?

• I have observed that civil services in India possess a remarkable capacity to effect change. The rise of social media and digital connectivity has highlighted the significant contributions of many civil servants, especially during the COVID-19 pandemic. Their efforts in vaccine distribution, enforcing lockdowns, and ensuring the provision of essential services underscored the vital role of civil services. This convinced me that civil service is my true calling, enabling me to give back to society. In my previous job, I felt underutilised and yearned for greater social interaction and impact. Additionally, my father, a retired civil servant, greatly influenced my decision, having witnessed his work and dedication since childhood. Despite holding an MBA, my family, particularly my parents, supported my decision to switch careers, recognising my desire to make a meaningful societal contribution.

2.) What was the most daunting part about your journey to become an IAS officer?

• During the COVID-19 pandemic, one of the most challenging aspects of preparing for exams was maintaining a consistent and patient study regime amidst social restrictions and isolation. With social interactions nearly nonexistent and everyone confined to their homes, keeping spirits high and preparing with the same intensity each day was a formidable task. Additionally, dealing with failure is a significant hurdle for aspirants. Unlike previous academic stages such as the 10th, 12th, or even MBA exams, which many clear in one go, the UPSC exams are a great leveler. Here, candidates from various prestigious backgrounds, including IITs, NITs, and foreign institutions, compete, and everyone is at the top of their class. The challenge is to be at one's best to surpass these students. Failure is inevitable in this iourney, and each setback requires starting afresh. Thus, immense mental and emotional resilience is necessary to persevere and prepare for subsequent attempts.

3.) You mentioned moments of demotivation during your journey. What kept you going despite those challenges?

• There were numerous times when I felt utterly demotivated, finding the situation unbelievable. Each failure brought the nagging question of whether

success was even possible. However, my

unwavering belief in the purpose of my journey and my potential. Impact of my contributions kept me driven. My friends and family were an immense source of encouragement and think I couldn't have succeeded without them. Additionally, I continuously learned from past mistakes, developed new strategies to overcome challenges, and reminded myself that top achievers have faced similar struggles. This mindset sustained my motivation and ensured my progress.

4.) What are some of the significant learning you had in your two years at K J Somaiya Institute of Management?

 College life presented a distinctive experience for me. I held multiple roles, including being a member of the student council and serving as the hostel head, vice president of the Melange team, and head of debating and quizzing for the acumen committee. Balancing these commitments while maintaining good academic grades taught me valuable lessons in time management and task-oriented frameworks. At KJSIM, I learned to approach tasks with structured frameworks and to focus on outcomes, ensuring efficiency in my efforts. This approach extended to my exam preparation, where I meticulously scheduled my study sessions weekly, daily, and monthly, ensuring that my efforts were directed towards achieving the desired outcomes. My experiences at KJSIM, as well as during my MBA, were instrumental in my success in the examination

5.) What would be your advice for the students and young Alumni, starting their careers?

• It seems that recent MBA graduates, particularly younger alumni, differ in their approach compared to past cohorts. For many, obtaining an MBA degree marks the completion of their formal education, with a primary focus on securing the highest package possible during their studies. However, post-selection, it's imperative for these young professionals to reflect on their true capabilities life skills beyond just professional and qualifications. Success is more than just a hefty paycheck; it involves effective communication, leadership, and a drive to create positive change. Volunteering in slums or teaching in government schools demonstrates a commitment to making a meaningful difference in society.

— Dr. Aparna Bhat Published an 'A' Category Research Paper —

- Dr. Aparna Bhat, Associate Professor Finance & Law department, published an 'A' category research paper titled 'The Asymmetry in Day and Night Option Returns: Evidence from an emerging Market' in Journal of Future Markets, a Q1 journal
- The study demonstrates that option selling tends to be more profitable overnight rather than intraday, indicating that sellers are compensated mainly for assuming overnight risk
- The new research on S&P 500 and Nifty options uncovers an asymmetry with positive overnight returns and negative intraday returns, indicating that profits from delta-hedged option selling strategies mainly arise from overnight risk affected by the variance risk premium


